

TOWNSHIP OF PEQUANNOCK

ORDINANCE NO. 2015-18

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 160 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PEQUANNOCK ENTITLED "STREETS AND ROADS" CONCERNING RESTRICTIONS ON STREET OPENINGS

BE IT ORDAINED Township Council of the Township of Pequannock, County of Morris, as follows:

Section 1. Section 160.06.130 Subsection I is hereby amended to read as follows

I. No road openings shall be issued for a period of five years after the completion of initial roadway construction or repaving except under extraordinary circumstances with the approval of the Township Council. However, road opening for utility connections may be permitted, administratively, by the Township Engineer with the following repair/restoration requirements:

- The trench repair shall be installed to a depth within (5") inches of existing roadway grade and shall include quarry process back fill compacted in one foot lifts. The pavement shall be replaced with five (5") inches of hot mix asphalt, in accordance with current New Jersey Department of Transportation standards.
- The road must be allowed to settle a minimum of 30 days with a maximum of 90 days, at which time the final pavement and all seams shall be infrared treated to ensure the new pavement blends thoroughly with the existing pavement. The timing of the infrared treating operation must conform to the manufacturer's recommendations.


Section 2: If any section, paragraph, sentence, (or part thereof) shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the remaining sections, paragraphs or sentences (or parts thereof) of the Ordinance, except so far as the section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 3: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.


Section 4: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication in the manner provided by law.
