There were 2 members of the public in attendance.


Township Manager David Hollberg reviewed the projected revenues and proposed rates for the 2018 Water Utility, Sewer Utility, Solid Waste Utility and Recreation Utility budgets and recommended the Council consider raising the base rate for water to \$10 in two years.

Members of the Council discussed various aspects of the Water, Sewer, and Solid Waste Utility budgets and agreed to consider adjusting the bulk rates for the Water Utility in 2 years, and to review the charges for certain recreation programs.


No formal action was taken.
