## **REGULAR MEETING**

# July 22, 2008

Time & Place

The minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Pequannock Township Council, County of Morris, New Jersey, held July 22, 2008, in the Municipal Building.

Present

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M. with the following present: Mayor Kapotes, Councilmen Jorgensen, Skvarca, Vanderhoff; Attorney Oostdyk; Manager Boyle and Township Clerk Sweeney. Councilman Engelbart was excused.

Mayor Kapotes announced that requirements of Public Law c.231 have been complied with for this meeting through notice of date, time, place and proposed Agenda being posted in the Municipal Building and mailed to 5 area newspapers, including the Official Township newspaper.

Special Presentation

Cell Tower Presentation - Mr. Martin McGee T.K. Design Associates - Representing T-Mobile Gave a presentation about installing a cell tower on the property at the Town Hall. Discussion and exhibits were displayed to show their need for a cell tower in this vicinity to keep up with the quality of service.

Mayor opens the hearing to the public.

Public Discussion Henry Samek - 4 Misty Court - Pompton Plains Questioned the private use of the cars by the Township Manager and Health Officer.

> Mayor Kapotes said he doesn't know what the Manager does but hopes the Township Manager uses his discretion. The good news is the Council is going to put a Township Vehicle Policy in place.

Mr. Samek asked why the Township Manager and Health Officer have confidential license plates on their cars. They should have Municipal Government plates like all the other Township vehicles.

Mayor Kapotes said that this will be looked into.

Mr. Samek spoke on Ordinance #2008-20 which adjusts the minimums and maximums on the salary guide. He stated that if the guideline is set on a 4% salary increase why did some Department Heads get a 15% increase in one year. There seems to be a loop hole and it should be looked at.

Anthony Franchino - 21 Lyman Avenue - Pequannock Suggested that the Township residents should bag their leaves. With the cost of gas and overtime the town could save money.

Nate Glinbizzi - 25 Richards Street - Pequannock Asked the Mayor to reconsider the 5 minute rule for public comment. He said that it is doing a disservice to the community. If the room is full of people wanting to speak on a hot topic then the 5 minute rule is appropriate.
