#### Narrative

During annual immunization audits in 2010, public health nurses observed many children without documentation of their seasonal influenza vaccine in childcare centers and preschools. New Jersey state mandated influenza vaccinations in daycare and preschool settings in the 2008-2009 influenza season. Just one year later, during the 2009-2010 influenza season, that mandate was lifted due to shortages of seasonal influenza vaccine and actions to prevent the spread of pandemic H1N1. Another contributing factor may have been that the yellow immunization cards did not include influenza until the 2008 printing. Therefore, schools were continuing to add immunizations on to old cards and did not have the visual trigger to follow up on influenza vaccinations.

In 2010 the health department was part of a quality improvement project titled 'Improving Documentation of Seasonal Influenza Vaccination in Childcare Settings.' The Public Health Nurse teamed up with the Morris Regional Public Health Partnership to form a minicollaborative and an aim statement was established for this project.

The aim statement: By February 1, 2011 the rate of documentation of seasonal influenza vaccination status among preschool and childcare centers will increase from 57% to 80%.

A Tool Kit was created by the group. The Tool Kit contained reference material for childcare staff to utilize in order to help the staff facilitate this goal. The Tool Kit addressed the broader picture of vaccinations, documentation and communicable disease reporting.

In 2010, at the start of the project, the rate from the preschool audits was at 41.28%. In 2011, after distributing the Tool Kit to the childcare centers the rate of documentation increased to 79.20%. The recent data from the 2012-2013 audits produced a documented rate of 88.91%.
