Dear Past Participant,

As a past participant of the Health Department's annual SMAC program, we would like to inform you that the Department will no longer offer this program. In recent years we have seen a great decline in participation and a survey conducted in 2012 revealed that most participants did have a primary care provider and health insurance. Fifty-one percent of the participants attended for the convenience of location. Over the last several years, we have not seen any new members of the community take part in the program, despite aggressive advertising. We are hopeful that all of you will continue to follow-up with your primary medical provider for laboratory evaluations and routine medical care.

Most private insurance plans allow for laboratory diagnostic testing to be performed annually and follow up as necessary. We do not wish to repeat services that are already available. It is the role of the Health Department to encourage our residents to establish a relationship with a primary health care provider who can provide a reliable "medical home" and a continuity of care for each individual.

If you or someone you know is uninsured or under-insured for laboratory services, please contact the Health Department at 973-835-5700 ext. 109. The nurses can refer you to one of the several Federally Qualified Health Centers in the area which can perform these services at low or no cost to the patient.
